THIRD ANNUAL LEGS AGAINST LYME WALK



Grow our K-12 youth education pilot program in area schools in all three counties. When you teach a child, you teach a generation. 3.


Expand our provider education program beyond the annual Lyme Summit to include medical students and provider education year-round.
